



Drake Graduate Credit: ITAG 2009

Drake University will provide one or two credit hours of graduate level credit @ \$100/hour for either for either Programming or Psychology toward the Iowa Talented and Gifted Teacher Coordinator endorsement. Students registering for either one or two graduate credits hour must attend the full conference on both Monday and Tuesday. During the conference, students register for the course at the Drake ITAG Graduate Credit Session, as scheduled in the conference program or by stopping by the Drake exhibit booth. You may also register by contacting mary.anderson@drake.edu by the end of the conference week.

Course requirements include ITAG session summaries and a pre-approved graduate credit project. Both are due by late November of this year. Guidelines for graduate credit will be explained by attending the Drake Graduate Credit Session. Drake offers all 12 hours for the Iowa Endorsement in a fully online program. The ITAG conference for credit is designed to count toward the Iowa GT endorsement. Contact ann.martin@drake.edu to apply to the Drake GT endorsement program.
